 Holding Tank Monitor

I got tired of inaccurate readings and bought the 4-tank monitor system from Ferriello Sales. I corresponded with Ferriello and he was very helpful as far as choosing the right unit. No help was required for installation because it's easy and well documented. The level sensors (one immersion type for potable water and one plastic tank 'stick-on' for the holding tank) have been accurate and dependable. .  
Also, no affiliation, just a satisfied consumer. Be sure to mention BOC and Ferriello will likely sweeten the deal.

I just installed a monitoring unit from Ferriello also. It monitors up to 8 tanks. It also will work with a variety of sending units. I have a waste tank sender from Ferriello, two fuel tank sending units from Centroid and two water tank units from WEMA. They all work and you can program the monitor to alert you when the tank is either full (holding) or empty (fuel and water) buzzer (day and/or night) and red light.

I also have no affiliation with Ferriello. Just very pleased with my system and great service. I called with a problem and got a return call the same day (Sunday!!)
